Hello Seniors!

This is meant to be a helpful resource for organizing your applications to colleges. In addition, you should ALSO meet with your School Counselor to discuss your plans. Please make sure you check the deadlines & requirements on all the colleges you are interested in applying to - make a plan to complete EVERYTHING before the deadline.

How do you check deadlines & requirements?

- You can Google "application requirements for _____(insert college name here)"

- 2. Create a Common App account
 - a. Go to the "My Colleges" tab
 - b. Add any colleges you want to apply to
 - c. Click on each college, scroll down to see what's required.

Application deadline terms

Early Action

(Usually November 1 or November 15). Apply early so you get your admission decision early. This is a GOOD OPTION, because it can relieve some stress and some schools consider you for additional scholarships!

Rolling Admissions

These schools will review applications as soon as they are submitted. They do not have a hard deadline, but remember....certain programs fill up very early so you should think about applying early.

Early Decision

This may be an option if (1) you have high financial need and the school covers full need (usually competitive schools) or (2) your family has the ability to pay for your college and this is your top choice school.

keep in mind you can only apply to 1 school Early Decision and you will not be able to compare financial aid from multiple schools if you choose this option

Regular Decision

Apply at the same time as most other people.

Common Requirements (for 4 year colleges or universities)

- 1. College application [DO THIS IN COMMON APP]
 - a. Many schools use the Common Application or their own specific form
 - i. THESE ARE YOUR FIRST STEPS ON COMMON APP
- College Essay (<u>here's a helpful guide to get started</u>) [DO THIS IN COMMON APP]
 - a. Some colleges request shorter "supplemental writing" (you can check in Common App >> My Colleges >> Writing)
- 3. <u>Letters of Recommendation</u> (1 or 2 teachers, 1 counselor) [DO THIS IN SCOIR]
 - a. Give all your recommenders a **BRAG SHEET**
- 4. Transcript ask your School Counselor in the Main Office [DO THIS IN SCOIR]

Community College

Thinking about attending community college next year? Well, the process is simpler than the one described above.

- 1. <u>Create an account with CCV</u> (if you don't already have one)
- 2. Complete a CCV Application
- 3. Fill out and submit the FAFSA
- 4. Fill out and submit the VSAC Grant Application
- 5. Schedule a "New Student Advising" appointment

September 30	Link your Common App to your SCOIR account.	*This is really important – it will allow colleges to receive transcripts and letters of recommendation from WHS!
Ongoing	Please make sure to add all of the colleges you want to apply to within SCOIR Instructions on page 5 of this document.	By organizing your applications within SCOIR, you will have built-in checklists of tasks to complete, as well as a place to view any deadlines. The more accurate your SCOIR account is, the easier it is for your School Counselor and Teachers to support you.
