From the Superintendent

Dear Winooski community,

It has been a busy, productive, and fun winter for the schools. Students are about to begin doing their yearly testing and the end-of-year season of field trips, capstone projects, and performances is about to pick up. One more thing that has been a little eventful has been the weather. The unpredictability of snow, ice, and related hazardous conditions has made it very hard for me and fellow



superintendents in the area to make the call for snow days. Our students, particularly, had strong feelings about my decision not to cancel school in early February, and I responded with information that you could be interested in as well. The original message is edited for brevity:

"Please know that weather-related closure decisions are made extremely carefully. When a school is closed, we receive substantial pushback from families because it disrupts their plans, especially for parents and caregivers who have jobs that do not allow them the flexibility to leave and pick up their students or care for younger children during unplanned times. On the other hand, the safety of students and staff sometimes forces us to close the schools when it is likely that the conditions will be hazardous during travel time. This puts a superintendent in a difficult position; no matter the decision, someone will be upset. If we close, some may be upset if they believe there is no true emergency. If we stay open, students and staff will likely have concerns. I understand. So, my decision ultimately is made independent of this pushback and based purely on information from NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric

Administration), our local crews, and collaboration with neighboring districts. Superintendents begin collaborating at 4am and monitor the weather before deciding. No matter the angle you see it, there is never a "right" decision. We just make it with the best information at our disposal."

On a separate but also safety-related update, our second and last options-based drill occurred on Wednesday, January 29. These drills are required by state law to take place twice a year. Winooski has created a compressive set of procedures for these drills that comply with the requirements while also being responsive to staff and student feedback. Although not required, additional training is currently being planned for staff (no students) to potentially go into more depth about the options in an active shooter emergency. This training, led by Officer Saja Almogalli, will potentially require a more intense approach to relaying information and lessons learned from actual incidents around the nation, but staff will be able to opt-out if they believe their mental health may be affected by the proposed exercises. More information will be provided to staff once the draft plan has been developed and approved by the Public Safety Committee.

Finally, signs have been placed around the district facilities to designate classrooms as "Private Learning Areas" and other areas within the premises as "Sensitive Zones," where only authorized teachers and staff are allowed to enter and work with students. This is an additional measure in preparation for the unlikely event of immigration enforcement inside our schools. While these signs do not prevent them from entering spaces, they make our expectations clear, visible, and unambiguous. This is one of the several precautions we are putting in place as part of a larger set of procedures based on our campaign to help all focus on their learning rather than be afraid.

Thank you, as always, for supporting our schools.

Kindergarten screening for Winooski residents will take place on **April 10th and 11th, 2025**!

If you have a child who will be 5 years old by September 1, 2025, they are eligible to start Kindergarten for the 2025-26 school year.



Health Office Update

A few reminders from the health office as we head into spring!

Spring Sports:

- If you have a student-athlete planning to participate in spring sports, they must have had a sports physical within the last two years, and we must have a copy on file
- If your student-athlete has already played in a fall or winter sport, and we already have a copy on file, they are good to go. Please reach out to our athletic director or the nurses with any questions.

Kindergarten Registration:

One of our favorite days of the year is kindergarten registration! We love seeing all of the little ones and their families prepare for the next chapter of their lives. When you arrive at kindergarten registration, the health office will need the following information:

 Immunizations: copy of the complete set, incomplete set with date of next PCP appointment or religious exemption form



 Medical information: please plan on notifying the nurse if your child has a medical condition or will need to take prescription medications in the health office during the school day

Illness:

Lastly, we continue to see an uptick in illnesses throughout the school year. Monitor your child's symptoms and call your primary care physician's (PCP) office when needed. It's not too late to get the flu shot. Ask your child's PCP if it's right for them.

Pre-Kindergarten Notices

ACT 166 Publicly Funded Pre-Kindergarten for children between the ages of 3 and 5 who reside in the town of Winooski, Vermont

Preschool Skills Screening & Pre-registration

*New and returning families must complete a new pre-registration form EACH year to participate.

What is publicly funded pre-kindergarten education?

Publicly funded pre-kindergarten education is defined as:

Ten hours per week for 35 weeks in a community private early care and education programs. These preapproved programs meet specific quality standards and provide developmentally appropriate learning experiences that are based on Vermont's Early Learning Standards. Children who reside in Winooski and are between the ages of three-five are eligible. Prekindergarten education is limited to the academic year (September – June).

Are these 10 hours/week pre-kindergarten programs tuition-free?

The pre-kindergarten program offered in public school is tuition-free. The pre-kindergarten program offered through a partner program will charge families for the care and education program the child needs beyond the 10 hours/week during the academic year. Your child's preschool must deduct these public funds from your annual tuition bill.

Is my child eligible for publicly funded prekindergarten?

If your child is 3 years old by September 1, 2025, and resides in Winooski, then your child is eligible to participate.

How much will the Winooski School District pay?

The Agency of Education established the statewide rate of \$3,982.00 per child for the 2024/2025 school year. This covers 10 hours per week of high-quality pre-kindergarten education for 35 weeks.

How do I apply?

- Winooski residents must first be enrolled at a pre-qualified preschool program in order to receive Act 166 funding. You need to contact the program directly to enroll your child. To search pre-qualified preschool programs visit: *Bright Futures Information System*
- 2. Once enrolled in a pre-qualified preschool program, then complete the Winooski ACT 166 Pre-registration Form to let WSD know what program your child will be attending for the school year. *Returning families must update their PowerSchool forms EACH year.





3. Upload all documents to PowerSchool. A copy of the child's birth certificate and your proof of residency (a utility bill or mortgage/lease) will be needed to participate.

Preschool Skills Screening & Pre-registration

If your child is or will be 3 by September 1st, 2025

please complete a Preschool Pre-registration Form for ACT 166 Publicly Funded Pre-K or to inquire about a Winooski Preschool Program and attend our preschool skills screening day. If you have concerns about your child's development, our Winooski Early Childhood team will screen your child's development. **This screening is play-based and free** for 3 and 4-year-old children living in Winooski.

- Where: In the preschool classroom at JFK Elementary School, room D185

Technical Challenge, and they had an incredible showing! Not only did they tackle the competition with teamwork and resilience, but they also brought home the Judges' Choice Award!

"One thing that was really cool was winning the Judges' Choice Award," said Winooski HIgh School junior and robotics team member Eliza Willis. "Our team did an amazing job —we worked together and shared roles, and we were able to adjust to challenges like when our robot broke."

"The local FIRSTinVT program administrators have really been championing our efforts to create a middle/highschool FIRST team, helping us to navigate the team start up process and providing a grant that allowed us to register our team and purchase the resources we needed to participate in the Into the Deep 2024-25 FTC season," says Work-based Learning Coordinator Jessica Handrik. "Combined with the City of Winooski's successful effort to launch the FIRST Lego League this year (with support from Global Foundries and 21C and FIRSTinVT), students enrolled in the Winooski School District now have access throughout their education here to this important career readiness opportunity that goes beyond the building of the robot and is about youth leadership and collaboration. We experienced this community of collaboration at the February 8 meet and I can't wait to see where the students take this."

"I am so proud of the students for their hard work this season. They showcased their leadership by starting a robotics team at

All legal residents, regardless of citizenship status, can vote in this election. If you're reading this after Town Meeting Day, thank you for casting your vote on local issues and engaging in the public process. Big thanks to all the staff and volunteers who make this important Vermont tradition a success. Looking forward, there are several big construction projects on the horizon.

We'll continue the **Main Street Revitalization** project (*winookivt.gov/mainstreet*) this spring with underground utility work and streetscape improvements including an uphill bike lane, wider sidewalks, crosswalk improvements, tree planting, and more. Residents and visitors should keep an eye out on City channels in the coming months for an exciting marketing campaign in support of businesses on Main Street. We also encourage everyone to sign up for the weekly construction updates and traffic alerts ahead of the construction season.

The Burlington/Winooski Bridge Replacement project (burlingtonwinooskibridge.vtransprojects. vermont.gov) is slated to begin in 2027 and the Exit 16 Diverging Diamond Interchange project (exit16ddi.vtransprojects.vermont.gov) will resume this year in Colchester. Construction on the hotel

project (commonly known as Winooski Falls East or Lot 7D) also resumes this year, adding a new parking garage and workforce housing to our downtown.

The **transfer of the O'Brien Community Center** to the Champlain Housing Trust will be complete and renovations to expand the community-focused services within will begin. Certainly an exciting time to live in Winooski!

From Your Local Representative

This past month the Vermont House has made progress on critical issues impacting our community, reinforcing our shared commitment to equity, affordability, and our well-being.

Affordable Housing & Community Stability:

The House recently passed the Budget Adjustment Act (BAA) which prioritizes housing security by allocating \$8.6 million to expand affordable housing and shelter capacity. Additionally, \$2.8 million will pilot supportive housing for adults with developmental disabilities, and \$1.8 million will extend emergency winter housing for vulnerable Vermonters. Additionally, \$10 million has been allocated to stabilize mental health and substance use treatment providers, ensuring continued access to essential services.

Responding to the Governor's Proposal for Education:

The Governor has proposed a radical education governance overhaul, reducing Vermont's 52 supervisory unions to just five large districts, each governed by a part-time elected board. This plan aims to scale resources, expand specialized services, and promote tax equity. However, concerns have been raised about the impact on local school decision-making and inequities in school choice policies. We are carefully reviewing the details and encourage you to as well. Please tune in to Winooski school board meetings, and reach out to Rep. Tomlinson and I to weigh in on state decision making.

Healthcare: My recent committee discussions have focused on hospital and healthcare system reform—fundamental steps in addressing our rising cost of education and of healthcare. We are investigating reference-based pricing which would align commercial insurance reimbursement rates with a percentage of Medicare to control costs. At the time of this writing (Feb 9) we are also taking up legislation (H.96) that would streamline regulatory reviews on health facilities before they make major purchases, new facilities

or building modifications. This is another effort to address administrative burden that significantly builds the costs we ultimately pay as patients.

Community Safety & Well-being: Investments in courthouse security upgrades and continued emergency shelter funding reinforce Vermont's commitment to public safety. Additionally, legislative discussions continue around criminal justice reforms, including initiatives supporting incarcerated individuals' rehabilitation and reintegration to community. H.98, which proposes to establish an expedited confirmatory adoption process for parents who conceived a child through assisted reproduction and are parents under State law, will be coming to the House floor for a vote next week! As your representative, I remain dedicated to advocating for policies that make Winooski a more affordable, equitable, and thriving community. Please share your thoughts—I value your input in shaping our future.



Main Street Revitalization

Project Timeline: Crews are expected to return to the project area in mid-March weather-permitting to mobilize equipment and install temporary traffic control devices and signage. Construction is scheduled to resume in early April. Work will continue this year through early winter. This project is projected to be completed by the summer of 2026.

- Replace water and sewer systems (Normand Street to Winooski/Colchester town line)
- Connect Lafountain Street to the new water main
- Install stormwater pipes
- Install underground electric and telecom utility infrastructure to relocate existing aerial utilities (includes conduit duct bank (Spring Street to Tigan Street) and telecom vaults and transformer pads

Main Street Makeover

- Reconstruct Main Street (railroad bridge near Maple Street to Winooski/Colchester town line)
- Excavation, grading, granite curb installation, and paving up to the binder course (Spring Street to Winooski/Colchester town line)
- Mill and pave top course of asphalt and driveways throughout project area
- Install permanent pavement markings, including reconfigured on-street parking and northbound bike lane

- New sidewalks, streetlighting, and roadway signs
- Landscaping with tree plantings
- Upgraded traffic signal equipment (Winooski Fire Station and Spring Street intersection)

Traffic and Parking Impacts During Construction

- 24/7 lane closure on Main Street (northbound traffic only)
- Southbound traffic detoured to Tigan Street and Weaver Street
- Intermittent side street closures at intersections with Main Street between railroad bridge and Tigan Street
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions
